Chemical Oceanography or Biological Oceanography. The successful candidate is expected to be highly motivated to research the marine biogeochemical cycles through fieldwork and laboratory experiments (using chemical or biochemical and molecular biological analyses) and be enthusiastic about graduate studies education in the Course in Biogeochemistry.
